2011 marks a historical year as the cable division becomes the Communications Department for the first time in history. In July 2011, Township Manager Gerald Richards recommended the cable division be reorganized into the Communications Department operating HOMTV, CAMTV, and the Communications and Media Relations for Meridian Township. Since that time, **Communications Specialist Brandie Hansen (07)** and **Communications Director Deborah Guthrie (96)** have co-led Township Communications providing P.R tools and techniques, marketing strategies, press releases, and a large social media presence. In 2012, Meridian Township residents will receive a newly designed Meridian Monitor newsletter and begin developments for e-news; all provided by way of the new structure.

In addition, **Communications Director Guthrie** and **Freelance Consultant Lynn Meikle** have been working with designers and engineers to overhaul the backbone of the almost 20 year old television production facilities. Approval from the Meridian Township Board this past spring made the facility redesign possible. Efficiency, space, training, and future media methods all played factors in the decision of streamlining informational programming being provided to the Meridian Township residents. All stories and scripts will be offline, no more multiple transferring of stories to be played out over air. All programs from past to present will be captured, stored, and logged in an archived master storage system.

Fun Factory Seeks Sponsors

The first is with a bus scholarship. Increasing demands on school budgets have made it difficult for classes to afford the cost of transportation to and from HOMTV's studio. The second opportunity is with t-shirts. Two-sided shirts featuring color images of Kiwi on the front and the Fun Factory on the back will be given to each student who visits to commemorate their experience. T-shirt sponsors will be acknowledged with the inclusion of their business logo on the back. Small and large logo sizes are available at \$100 and \$500 respectively. The cost will provide 500 shirts for the 2012 programming season.
