

#### New Perspective of "Senior Living" at HOM




In July 2015, Peggy Frisch kicked off the newest episode of "Senior Living" stating, "Welcome back to an old show, with some even older new faces."

### **HOMTV Welcomes New Staff Member** Ben Makulski



After graduation he started working as a producer at JTV in Jackson, working on the award-winning "Bart Hawley Show" and "JTV Sports".


In 2015, Ben moved on to become the video producer of the sports radio show. "Valenti

As the Assistant Director of Marketing and Public Relations at Flint's Bishop International Airport, I had the great pleasure of meeting up with our nation's President when he decided to make a visit to the Vehicle City.

One week out from the President's visit, the Secret Service arrived. From the moment they arrived, all details for the presidential visit

were handled by the Secret Service. Our fire lieutenant, Dan Owen, was the Secret Service's right-hand man throughout the week. I was lucky enough to shadow Lieutenant Owen throughout the week. It was an incredible experience! I was in awe of how much work goes into a presidential visit. The Secret Service leave nothing to chance and are true professionals.

On the day of the visit, Air Force One landed shortly before noon. Fifteen minutes prior to the arrival and 15 minutes after departure, the airspace around the airport is shut down. In addition, there is to be no movement on the ramp. This is crucial information for employees like myself who carry a special badge that gives them access to the ramp. Should there be unnecessary movement on the ramp, the President's visit could be jeopardized. Luckily everyone was well-informed and the President's

landing went incredibly well. When the President landed, his motorcade was waiting and he was swiftly escorted off the airport ramp and on to his visit at The Food Bank of Eastern Michigan and Flint's Northwestern High School.

Air Force One remained on the airport ramp for roughly 5 hours. During that time, several people including myself got to see the plane up close. It's not every day, Air Force One is parked outside your office.

While covering a presidential visit as a reporter is an awesome experience, being a part of the planning process at an airport is a unique opportunity. I am incredibly grateful for the opportunity. As in news, every day is different - and at the airport, you never know who you'll get the chance to meet.
